

# Another Creative Way to Use the CME Curriculum



Because the children in our church attend the regular worship services, it was hard to find a time to teach the children's mission lessons this year. So my NMI secretary and I put our heads together and planned the lessons around breakfast for the children prior to Sunday School.

We had two older gentlemen in our church be the cooks, and three ladies served. Each week a new person would teach the lesson for the Eurasia Region, using visuals and hands-on items, such as wooden shoes from the Netherlands and plastic windmills. (That particular teacher's brother is a missionary there from another denomination.)

Each child was also given a take home prayer card for each country in the region.

We also set up a tent to use as a prayer closet. We didn't have a tent big enough, so we stretched blankets from table to table. The boys and girls loved getting in there for prayer time.

This proved to be a successful teaching method, as we fed breakfast to up to 15 boys and girls for 13 weeks in a row.
