

...saw an altar in Damascus and sent to Uriah the priest for its construction. Uriah detailed the plans for an altar in accordance with all the plans that King Ahaz had sent from Damascus and finished it before King Ahaz returned. When the king came back from Damascus and saw the altar, he approached it and presented offering and grain offering, poured out his drink offering, and sprinkled the blood of his fellowship offerings on the altar. The bronze altar that stood before the LORD he brought from the front of the temple—from between the altars to the north side of the temple. King Ahaz took away the side panels and removed the basins from the movable stands. He removed the Sea from the bronze bulls that supported it and set it on a stone base. He took away the Sabbath canopy that had been built at the temple and removed the royal entryway outside the temple of the LORD, in deference to the king of Assyria.

As for the other events of the reign of Ahaz, and what he did, are they not written in the book of the annals of the kings of Judah? Ahaz rested with his fathers and was buried with them in the City of David. And Hezekiah his son succeeded him as king.

**Hoshea Last King of Israel**  
17 In the twelfth year of Ahaz king of Judah, Hoshea son of Elah became king of Israel in Samaria, and he reigned nine years. He did evil in the eyes of the LORD, but not like the kings of Israel who preceded him.

Shalmaneser king of Assyria came up to attack Hoshea, who had been Sargon's vassal and had paid him tribute. But the king of Assyria discovered that Hoshea was a traitor, for he had sent envoys to So<sup>112</sup> king of Egypt, and no longer paid tribute to him and put him in prison. The king of Assyria invaded the entire land, marched against Samaria and laid siege to it for three years. In the ninth year of Hoshea, the king of Assyria captured Samaria and deported the Israelites to Assyria. He settled them in Halah, in Gozan on the Habor River and in the towns of the Medes.

**Israel Exiled Because of Sin**

...All this took place because the Israelites had rebelled against the LORD their God, who had brought them up out of the land of Egypt. They followed the customs of the nations that the LORD had driven out before them, and they did things against the LORD their God that he had introduced. From watchtower to fortified city they built themselves high places, and Asherah poles on every high hill and under every spreading tree. At every high place they burned incense, as the nations whom the LORD had driven out before them had done. They did wicked things that provoked the LORD to anger. They worshiped idols, though the LORD had said, "You shall not do this." The LORD warned Israel and Judah through all his prophets and seers: Turn from your evil ways. Observe my commandments and decrees, in accordance with the entire Law that I delivered to you through my servants the prophets. But they would not listen and were as stiff-necked as their fathers, who did not trust in the LORD their God. They rejected his decrees and the covenant he had made with their fathers and themselves became worthless idols and themselves became worth-

...the LORD had ordered them to do as they do," and they did not listen. The LORD had forbidden them to do all the commands of the LORD, and they bowed down to all the gods that their sons and daughters practiced divination and themselves to do evil in the eyes of the LORD, provoking him to anger.

Then the king of Assyria gave this order: "Have one of the priests you took captive from Samaria go back to live there and teach the people what the god of the land requires." So one of the priests who had been exiled from Samaria came to live in Bethel and taught them how to worship the LORD.

Nevertheless, each national group made its own gods in the several towns where they settled, and set them up in the shape of calves, and shrines at the high places. The men from Babylon made Succoth Benoth, the men from Cush made Nergal, and the men from Hamath made Ashima. The Avvites made Nibhaz and Tartak, and the Sepharvites burned their children in the fire as sacrifices to Adrammelech and Anammelech, the gods of Sepharvaim. They worshiped the LORD, but they also appointed all sorts of priests in the shrines to officiate for them as priests in the shrines at the high places. They worshiped the LORD, but they also served their own gods in accordance with the customs of the nations from which they had been brought into Assyria, until he thrust them away from the land.

The king of Judah was left, and he did not keep the commands of the LORD his God. They followed the customs that he had introduced. There were no prophets in Judah, and they rejected all the people of Israel and gave them into the hands of their enemies, until he thrust them away from the land. He made Jeroboam king of Israel, and he did not turn away from his sins. The LORD removed them from his land, as he had warned through all the prophets. So the people of Judah were taken from their homeland to Assyria, and they are still there.

...settled in Samaria to replace the Israelites who had been there, they first lived there, they worshiped the LORD; so he sent lions to Samaria and they killed some of the people you deported and removed the god of that country. He has sent lions among them, killing them off, because they do not know what he requires.


...You must worship the LORD and to him offer sacrifices. You must always be careful to keep the decrees and ordinances, the laws and commands that I wrote for you. Do not worship other gods. Do not forget the covenant I have made with you, and do not worship other gods. For they worship the LORD your God, it is he who will deliver you from the hand of all your enemies. They would not listen, however, but persisted in their former practices. Even while these people were worshiping the LORD, they were serving their idols. To this day their children and grandchildren continue to do as their fathers did.
